ECO & Flexible eligibility - Information sheet

Energy Company Obligation

Qualifying householders can access funding to provide home heating and insulation upgrades through the Government Energy Company Obligation (ECO) scheme.

The Energy Company Obligation (ECO) is a requirement placed upon energy companies to help improve the domestic energy efficiency of low-income homes and is administered by Ofgem on behalf of the Department for Energy, Business & Industrial Strategy (BEIS).



Flexible Eligibility

Flexible eligibility is designed to allow Councils to set criteria to assist those who would fall outside of the normal ECO eligibility criteria (health or income related benefits, known as the Affordable Warmth criteria) but who may still need financial assistance to make heating their home more affordable. If you currently claim benefits you do not need to apply to this scheme but directly to a participating energy supplier or installer highlighted on the webpage below.

Leicestershire County Council's (LCC) Warm Homes service has published eligibility criteria for residents living in the county, set out in a Statement of Intent document published online. Eligibility is dependent on a combination of factors such as income, household size, health & wellbeing and household energy efficiency. Please note that the measures offered may vary by supplier/installer and are subject to survey. ECO is designed to support low income and high energy cost households. Households that do not qualify are directed to consider private quotations.

Applications

What is Leicestershire County Council's role?

Your chosen installer will provide us with your completed application. LCC's role is to confirm if a household meets the eligibility criteria as set out in the Statement of Intent and will issue eligible applications with a declaration. In most cases this will be sent directly to the installer supporting your application who will then contact you to progress to installation. The installer uses the declaration to claim back the installation costs from an energy suppliers' ECO funds. If you have not yet approached a participating installer we will provide a list of the participating installers from which you are free to approach any installer(s) of your choice who will provide and complete an application form with you and return it to us. We may contact applicant households to confirm circumstances or request supporting evidence.

What is your role? (The Householder)

All householders accepting the installation of energy efficiency improvements to their homes are responsible for instructing/hiring the installer and must carry out their own checks on the installation company. Checks you should carry out:

 Check if you need planning permission or building regulations approval: Certain types of insulation such as external wall insulation might need planning permission and building regulations approval and as the homeowner it will be your responsibility to apply for this.

- Check if the installer is a member of a competent person scheme related to electrics or insulation work, like the NICEIC, CIGA or Stroma schemes. If they are then they will be able to self-certify their work, rather than needing to get building regulations approval from your local council.
- Check they are Gas Safe registered. By law all engineers installing gas boilers must be on the Gas Safe Register.
- Check if they provide any warranties on the installation.

Your installer will explain their own terms and conditions and confirm if any household contribution is required prior to proceeding with any work.

What to do if you're not happy with an installation?

Initial complaints about an installation should firstly be made to the company who installed the measure, but if problems persist you should contact <u>Citizens Advice Consumer Services</u> for free impartial advice on 0808 223 1133.

Further Information

The applicant and installer(s) are responsible for any agreement entered for the installation of measures and in ensuring the consent and permissions of the homeowner and/or landlord have been obtained prior to installation.

Any personal data you provide will be processed in accordance with current data protection laws. It will be stored and provided to Leicestershire County Council by participating installers. The data will used by Leicestershire County Council only for the purpose of assessing eligibility for support through this scheme as highlighted in the fair processing notice available online at: www.leicestershire.gov.uk/about-the-council/data-protection-and-privacy
