## Weight management and physical activity

Leicestershire offers a number of programmes to assist adults and children to maintain a healthy weight. Weightwatchers offer Leicestershire residents a free 12 week programme, whilst Leicestershire Nutrition and Dietetic service (LNDS) support people who have more complex needs, to lose weight, through its LEAP and FLIC programmes. Increasing levels of physical activity plays an important role in maintaining a healthy weight and an extensive range of “universal” activities suitable for every ability is available through local District and Borough Councils and leisure centres. In addition, District and Borough Councils also run a GP exercise referral programme, offering tailored physical activity programmes for patients with long term health conditions, such as cardiac, respiratory, mental health, to assist their long-term recovery and adoption of more healthier lifestyles.

An adult weight management service for patients with a BMI of 30 or above or a BMI of 28 or above with co-morbidities.

# Leicestershire and Rutland C-Card Scheme (Previously the Community Safer Sex Project)

## What does the service offer?

- Supports the delivery of community based sexual health services to ensure easy access to free condoms and pregnancy testing services, relationship advice and signposting to other services for young people aged under 25 years.

## How to access or refer to the service?


The C-card scheme starts from 1st August 2016. The new service builds on the previous community safer sex project and there will be a phased transition to convert the safer sex sites to the new C-card service. There will be C-card registration sites and new C-card distribution sites.

# Healthy Together Programme

## Public Health Nursing (Health Visiting 0-5 years)

### What does the service offer?

- Confidential advice, care and support to all families with babies and young children up to five years old
- Child health assessments
- Advice and support on child, parenting and adult matters (via telephone, advice clinics and text service)
- Central point of contact for services available to parents and their families
- Monitoring and promotion of the physical and emotional health of mothers, babies and their families. This includes giving advice and support on:
  1. General health
  2. Nutrition
  3. Behavioural difficulties
  4. Child development, including specialist
  5. developmental needs
  6. Postnatal depression and emotional wellbeing
  7. Domestic violence
  8. Social issues e.g. housing and finance
  9. Child protection
- Infant feeding promotion and management including specialist breastfeeding advice and support
- Child protection/safeguarding to ensure the safety and wellbeing of all children up to the age of five. This includes joint working with families and other agencies and professionals e.g. midwives, children's centres, GPs, school nurses and social workers, etc.



Health Visitors provide support and help at the following levels:

### Community level

Universal support for families at key stages:

- 28 to 36 weeks pregnant
- 10 to 14 days old
- 6 to 8 weeks old
- 3 to 4 months old
- 1 year old
- 2¼ years old

Universal antenatal four week education programme in partnership with midwives and children centres.

Universal plus offers extra support when families need it.

Universal Partnership Plus offers support over a period of time with working together with other agencies.
